

## USSSA – Slow Pitch Umpire Test 2010 Answer Sheet

Listed below are the answers to the Slow Pitch Umpire Test. Please remember there may be additional areas in the Rule Book than those noted below that pertain to each situation.

1. **b)** Yes, it is a new rule for 2010. **Rule 5 Sec. 6**
2. **a) and d)** Both apply. If legally appealed, the runner will be called out. **Rule 2 Sec. 7 Note**
3. **c)** 98 feet 11 inches. **Rule 1 Sec. 3A Example**
4. **c)** Double Play. **Rule 8 Sec 2-2. Rule 8 Sec 12 L Effect Sec 12L Rule 9 Sec 2-K**
5. **c)** No run scores, batter is out runner remains at 3<sup>rd</sup>. **Rule 7 Sec 2D-1**
6. **b)** 1 run scores. **Rule 8 Sec 5S, Effect Sec.5 S-T 5**
7. **c)** 2 runs score. Both runners are awarded home. Batter is out on the infield fly. **Rule 8 Sec 6H Effect 6H-1**
8. **b)** Correct call. **Rule 8 Sec 12 M**
9. **c)** 2 runs. Batter and all runners are awarded two bases from the time of the throw **Rule 8 Effect Sec 7F**
10. **a)** Point toward fair territory. Say nothing. **Rule 10 Sec 10-1. (Note: If the ball hits any part of the chalk line, it is fair.)**
11. **c)** Obstruction by the pitcher, award batter runner 1<sup>st</sup> base **Rule 8 Sec 3C Effect Sec 3C**
12. **b)** No run scores; Homerun is charged. **Rule 4-Sec 8A Effect Sec 8A**
13. **b)** No. Only one offensive conference allowed per inning. **Rule 5 Sec 8**
14. **b)** No pitch, dead ball. **Rule 5 Sec 1A, Rule 9 Sec 3A**
15. **d)** Batter runner is out while base runner safe at 1<sup>st</sup> because the force play was no longer in effect **Rule 8 Sec1, Rule 8 Sec 5M**

16. **c)** Legal action, batter runner is out **Rule 8 Sec 4E**
17. **c)** Unfairly delivered pitch. **Rule 6 Sec 9**
18. **c)** No. This is not the way the manufacturer produced the glove and in the umpire's judgment the pitcher is only using it to distract the batter and is considered to be unsportsmanlike conduct. **Rule 10 Sec 9 B Rule 10 Sec 1.**  
**(Note: National Umpire-In-Chief interpretation – If the pitcher refuses to change gloves or brings the glove out again, he shall be promptly ejected from the game. Refer to Rule 5 Sec 9E-1 Effect Sec 9C-F.)**
19. **b)** Dead ball. Runner awarded 3rd. Batter awarded 2<sup>nd</sup>. No run. **Rule 8 Sec 7F Effect Sec 7F-1**
20. **b)** Legal move. The correct batter assumes the count of 2 balls and 1 Strike **Rule 7 Sec 1E-2**
21. **b)** Legal Pitching Action. **Rule 2 Sec 6, Rule 6 Sec 3**
22. **d)** Base runner is safe as he needed to be tagged at the plate. **Rule 7 Sec 2J Effect, 2I-J**
23. **c)** Flip Flop Rule. **Rule 4, See Table**
24. **c)** Make him pitch to the first batter of the inning until his turn at bat is completed. **Rule 5 Sec 3D.**
25. **d)** Correct call. In order to be intentionally dropped ball, it must be touched by a fielder **Rule 9 Sec 2C&D**
26. **b)** Remove the pitcher from the pitching position for the remainder of the game **Rule 6 Sec 5C Effect Sec 5 A-C**
27. **c)** Remove the glove. Nullify the out. Award the batter and runners one base **Rule 8 Sec 7C Effect Sec 7C**
28. **b)** Call the runner out and eject him from the game. **Rule 8 Sec 5V Effect Sec 5V**
29. **c)** Unfairly delivered pitch. **Rule 6 Sec 1. Rule 6 Sec 9A Effect Sec 9 A-E and Note 9 A-E**
30. **d)** The batter returns to bat with the same ball and strike count he had prior to hitting the home run. **Rule 13 Sec 2**
31. **a)**The player who owns the bat is ejected from the park and suspended

for a minimum of one year with no appeal. **Rule 2 Sec 2E- a-i-ii-F, Rule 7 Sec 2B**

32. **c)** Ball is dead, no pitch, as a player does not have to ask for "time" as long as the pitcher has not started his motion. **Rule 7 Sec 3F**

33. **a)** The batter is out. **Rule 7 Sec 2G**

34. **c)** Ball remains live, batter runner called out for passing R1. **Rule 9 Sec 2P**

35. **c)** 9, 10 or 12 **Rule 13 Sec 3**

36. **c)** Remove the lead pipe from the game because it is not a USSSA approved warm-up device **Rule 2 Sec 2B**

37. **c)** Batter-Base Runner is declared out and no run scores **Rule 8 Sec 4G Effect Sec. 4G-H**

38. **b)** 2 outs. Runner awarded 3<sup>rd</sup> Batter out for entering dead ball area. **Rule 8 Sec 4G-H Effect Sec 4G-H**

39. **a)** All programs. **Rule 4 Sec 3F**

40. **c)** 15 after 3, 12 after 4, 10 after 5. **Additional Playing Rules Not Found In USSSA Rule Book**

41. **c)** 1.20 **Rule 2 Sec. 2D**

42. **d)** b & c both apply. (Unfairly delivered pitch) **Rule 6 Sec 9.**

43. **c)** Batter is out. All runners are awarded one base. **Rule 8 Sec 7A-1.**

44. **d)** Runner is out for coach assisting runner. **Rule 8 Sec 5L**

45. **d)** Unfairly delivered pitch **Rule 6 Sec 4G, Rule 6 Sec 9**

46. **b)** 65 or 70 feet. **Rule 1 Sec 3A**

46. **b)** Foul ball on the batter **Rule 7 Sec 5-2**

48. **d)** Batter-runner is safe and batter runner and runner on 2<sup>nd</sup> both score **Rule 6-12 Effect Sec 12-A**

49. **c)** Legal as long as it is on the licensed and approved bat list **Rule 2 Sec.2 C-D**

50. **d)** Request granted as the defensive team may walk the preceding batter or multiple batters to get to the position or positions in the lineup that is an out due to hitting a home run. **Rule 4 Sec. 8E Note, Rule 11 Sec. 2 Note, Rule 13 Sec. 3 Note**
51. **c)** This was a new rule for 2008. Deleted old rule.
52. **d)** A, B, and C apply, **Rule 3 Definition of Bench or Dugout**
53. **b)** If the pitcher had a reasonable chance of catching the ball, the ball remains live and all base runners are in jeopardy. **Rule 9 Sec 2K**
54. **a)** No interference Runner is out **Rule 8 Sec 6-A. Rule 9 Sec 2D, J**
55. **a)** Legal Play. **Rule 2 Sec 8.**
56. **a)** Remove the player from the game until he gets the bleeding stopped and changes any bloody clothing **Rule 5 Sec 4 A,B & C**
57. **c)** Obstruction. Batter awarded 1<sup>st</sup>. Warn the pitcher not to repeat this action. **Rule 8 Sec. 3C Also see Rule 3-Definition of Obstruction**
58. **b)** Batter-runner awarded 3<sup>rd</sup> Runner on 2<sup>nd</sup> base awarded home **Rule 8 Sec 7F-2**
59. **c)** One run scores all runners advance one base due to the hit. **Rule 8 Sec 6A-2 Rule 9 Sec. 3W**
60. **c)** 2 base award. **Rule 8 Sec 7B Effect Sec. 7B**
- 61.. **a)** Offensive, spectator and umpire **See Rule 3 – Definition of Interference**
- 62 **d)** Declared “out”. Each subsequent time that position in the lineup is due to bat the batter shall automatically be declared out. The player shall remain in the game for defensive purposes only. This applies to any substitute in that batting position. **Rule 4 Sec 8E**
63. **b)** The infraction constitutes interference. All Play stops; the ball is dead and the most advanced runner is called out. **Rule 8 Sec K Effect Sec. 5 F-K.**

64. **d)** The base umpire should ask for help if the coach asks him to like a professional. **National U.I.C. recommendation**
65. **d) Rule 3 Definition-Force Out. Rule 8 Sec. 5N**
66. **a)** Shall not be outside the vicinity of the designated dugout (bench) area if not a batter, base runner, on deck batter, in the coaches' boxes or one of the 10 players on defense. **Rule 5 Sec. 9D**
67. **b)** Any fair fly ball touched by a defensive player which then goes over the fence in fair territory will be declared a four base award and it is not to be included in the total over the fence home runs. **Rule 4 Sec. 8A-2**
68. **d)** A,B,C all apply. **Rule 3 Definition of Catch.**
69. **c)** It will be an inning ending out along with an offensive ejection and an out each time that spot in the lineup is due to bat. **Rule 4 Sec. 8C**
70. **d)** A team can start with a minimum of 9 players. **Rule 11 Sec. 2 Note**
